Staffing changes for January 2025:

As you are all aware, myself, Mrs Thomas and Miss Jones are leaving at the end of term. Following on from the letter sent to you by the governing body, I am very pleased to be able to update you on staffing.

Ms. Heather will take post as the Acting Headteacher and Mrs Wallis as the Acting Deputy Headteacher in January; both are already part of the Senior Leadership Team at Dingle and will do an amazing job for our children.

Class D (Reception) will be taught, after Christmas until February half term, by Miss Slater and Mrs Downing, both of whom are experienced teachers who are familiar with Dingle and familiar to the children in class D. School drop-off and collection, classes D to S

Please remember that the school doors open at 8.40am and children are expected to be in class by 8.45am when the doors will be closed. This is signalled by a bell. Children arriving after this time will need to come through the main office and will be registered as late. They must be signed in using the electronic system, for Health and Safety reasons.

The school day ends at 3.10pm and children must be collected by 3.15pm. If they are not collected by then, they will be taken to After School Club and charges will apply. Information on these charges can be found on the school website and have been implemented by the governing body.
