Dingle Community Primary is an inclusive school.

There are 29 children on the SEN register.

There are a further 15 children on our "concern" list who may require additional support for emotional wellbeing.

38% of children with SEN support are entitled to FSM

40% of children with EHCP'S are entitled to FSM

This is fully in line with national figures.

Nationally, 72 % of EHCP's are issued to boys and 67% of children at SEN support level are boys.

At Dingle Community Primary, 72% of EHCP's are issued to boys and 62% of children at SEN support level are boys.
